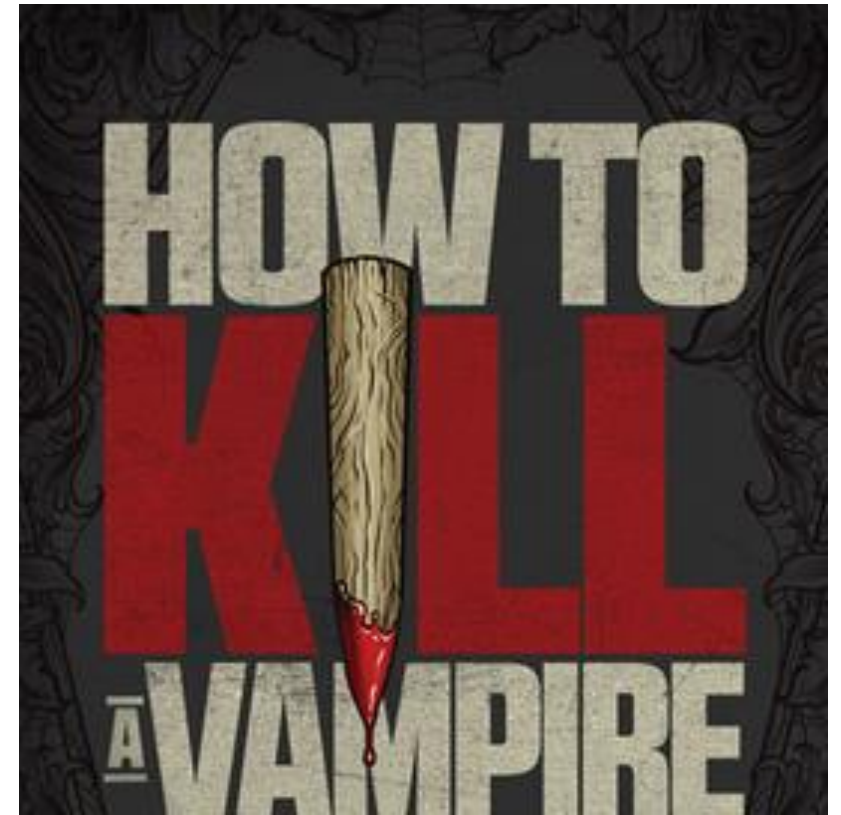


Instruction Writing

	Title which shows what the text is about. It may begin "How to..."		Adverbs for how the actions should be done.
	Sub-headings to break the text into clear sections.		Chronological order and time conjunctions
	An opening sentence which encourages the reader to have a go.		Technical vocabulary which is specific to the task.
	A clear list of equipment or ingredients needed.		Diagrams or illustrations with labels.
	Simple steps for each action in the method.		Technical/ topic vocabulary
	Imperative (bossy) verbs telling the reader what to do.		Closing statement which shows or describes what the reader has achieved.
	Bullet points or numbers for each step.		Modal verbs to show the degree of possibility (might, should, etc).

Introduction (Opening)

- Try and start with a rhetorical question, like ‘Can you build up the courage and stamina to slay a vampire?’ or ‘Do you think you’ve got what it takes to kill these undead monsters?’
- Next in one sentence explain briefly what vampires are.
- Then we need to mention some of their unique abilities (only one or 2 sentences).
- Finally, we need to note some of their weaknesses and vulnerabilities that can lead into our instructions.



Introduction WAGOLL (What a good one looks like)

Do you think you've got what it takes to kill these undead monsters? Vampires are evil spirits that lurk around graveyards trying to sneak into someone's grave. These immortal creatures feed on blood to sustain their energy. Their supernatural abilities include wall-climbing, shape-shifting and superhuman strength and speed. However, these nocturnal beasts don't need to go undefeated. Sunlight, garlic and silver are just a few of their weaknesses. Armed with the right equipment, vampires can cease to exist...
